On the way they (4) saw an old woman working (5) at a spinning-wheel and heard <u>(6) her</u> praising Allah for His <u>(7) bounties</u>. The Holy Prophet went (8) up to her, wished her (9) and enquired about her health. Then <u>(10) he</u> said to her, "Your <u>(11) faith</u> in the Almighty is <u>(12) commendable</u>. Would you tell me <u>(13) what</u> made you to believe <u>(14) in</u> Allah?" On hearing this, the <u>(15) woman</u> stopped working at the <u>(16) spinning-wheel</u>, thought for a while and <u>(17) then</u> replied: "O Prophet of <u>(18) Allah!</u> You see this spinning-wheel. (19) **As** long as I don't (20) move it, it can't spin. (21) When it so happens with (22) such an ordinary thing, how (23) can it be possible that (24) the mechanism of such a (25) vast universe should work so (26) punctually without a driving force. (27) **There** must be a Great (28) **Being** to run it - One (29) who should be controlling every (30) atom. That Great Being can (31) be Allah only, who is the (32) Creator and the Master of (33) everything!" The Holy Prophet was very (34) pleased with the old woman's (35) reply. Addressing his companions he (36) said, "Just see how this (37) old lady has come to (38) know about Allah in such (39) a fine and simple way. (40) Your faith in the Almighty Allah (41) should also be firm like (42) hers". A Muslim believes in the (43) **Oneness** of Allah.

FEAR OF ALLAH

When the mother of (1) Salama woke up in the (2) midst of the night, she (3) didn't find The Prophet (S) in (4) his bed. A bit worried, (5) she wondered where he would (6) be? She started searching for (7) him. She found him standing in (8) a dark corner, hands raised (9) to the heavens, crying and (10) saying: "My Lord! Do not (11) take away the good things (12) you have granted me. My (13) Lord! Do not make me (14) subject of hatred of my (15) enemies and the jeolous ones. (16) My Lord! Do not turn (17) me to the wrongs that you (18) have diverted me from. My Lord! (19) **Do** not ever leave me (20) on my own, even for a (21) fraction of a moment." As she (22) heard these sentences, Umme Salama (23) shivered with fear, and retired to a (24) corner and started weeping. Her (25) crying was so severe that (26) The Prophet (S) came to her (27) asking: "Why are you crying?" "(28) Why shouldn't I cry? You have (29) such a lofty place in (30) Allah's sight, yet you fear (31) **Him** to this degree. You (32) **ask** of Him not to (33) **leave** you on your own (34) even for a short while. (35) Woe to me!" "O Umme (36) Salma! - replied The Prophet (S) - How (37) can I not fear, and (38) remain content. Prophet Yunus (AS) was <u>(39) **left**</u> on his own, and you <u>(40) **know**</u> what happened to him."

JUNAID AND BAHLUL

Bahlul simulated madness, though (1) he was not mad. Junaid (2) a scholar and Sufi of (3) repute, knew him very well. (4) One day as they met, (5) Junaid requested him to give (6) him some counsel and admonition. "(7) You do not need any (8) **advice**. You are a well (9) **known** scholar," Behlool said. But Junaid (10) **insisted**. Behlool gave in and <u>(11) said</u>: "Well, I shall ask <u>(12) you</u> three questions. If you (13) answer them correctly, you will (14) be advised." And then he (15) proceeded to ask: "Do you (16) know how to talk?" "Do you know (17) how to eat?" "Do you know how <u>(18) to</u> sleep?" Junaid found these simple. <u>(19) **He**</u> said: "I know how to (20) talk. I talk with a (21) low voice, politely and to (22) the point, so that the (23) **listeners** are not at all (24) **offended**. I eat after having (25) **washed** my hands, say 'Bismillah' before (26) I commence, and chew the (27) food properly. When I finish, I (28) thank Allah. Before I go to (29) sleep, I do my wudhu (30) and retire to a clean (31) bed. Then I bear witness to (32) my faith and sleep." Bahlul stood (33) up and started walking away. He said: "I (34) thought you were quite learned. You (35) do not know the most (36) elementary things of Islam." But Junaid (37) would not let him go. "(38) Please guide me," he said. "(39) Well,"

Bahlul said, "It is <u>(40) no</u> use talking softly if <u>(41) it</u> is a lie, remembering <u>(42) Allah</u> before eating has no <u>(43) meaning</u> if the food you <u>(44) eat</u> is forbidden or usurped <u>(45) or</u> that the food has <u>(46) been</u> bought from the money <u>(47) of</u> an orphan, a widow or a <u>(48) fellowman</u>. And what is the <u>(49) use</u> of sleeping with wudhu and <u>(50) all</u> the recitations if your heart is full of malice, jealousy and enmity towards your brother in faith."

SOCIAL ETIQUETTE

When Prophet Muhammad (S) declared (1) himself to be The Messenger (2) of Allah, the people of (3) Arabia were leading a very (4) miserable life. They were rough (5) and ignorant people who were (6) not conversant with the decorum of (7) a civilized society. So much (8) so that they did not (9) care even to seek permission (10) before entering another's house and (11) did not wish each other <u>(12) when</u> they met. They considered <u>(13) themselves</u> to be enemies of <u>(14)</u> each other and spoke in a <u>(15)</u> very harsh tone. The Prophet (S) (16) gradually taught them the rules of (17) social behaviour and the principles of (18) **civilization** and culture. During the last (19) **fourteen** centuries, man has made (20) great progress in different walks of (21) life. Education has become very (22) **common** and modern means of (23) **transport** have made the world (24) much narrower. However, the universal and (25) eternal Islamic principles of civilization (26) continue to guide humanity. We (27) mention below some of them (28) which are well-known as well (29) as very important for our social life. If (30) we intend entering somebody's house (31) or room and the door (32) is shut, we should knock (33) at the door gently with a (34) view to seeking permission to (35) enter. If we happen to meet (36) some acquaintances in a gathering or (37) in a street, we should (38) wish them by saying "Salamun (39) Alaikum". While walking in a street, we <u>(40) **should**</u> be careful not to <u>(41) **bump**</u> into anyone. In case we (42) form part of a crowd, we should (43) walk behind one another so (44) that we do not block (45) the way of others. It is (46) necessary for us not to (47) disturb others. When others are (48) sleeping, we should remain quiet and should not disturb (49) their sleep by making noise. Most of (50) us are well aware of these rules and principles but are usually negligent in observing them. However, to lead a pleasant social life, it is incumbent upon us to understand these principles properly and to act upon them to the best of our ability. Islam teaches us the best social etiquette.

ALI AN THE CANDLE

A candle burnt by his side, as he sat (1) down meticulously recording all the revenue and the expenses of (2) the treasury. Just then Talha and Zubair appeared. They aspired to some (3) positions of authority in Ali's (AS) rule and had come to (4) strike a deal. If Ali (AS) gave them a place of (5) distinction, they would in turn pledge their full support. Being (6) an Infallible and sinless, Ali (AS) knew of this. Just as they (7) sat down, Ali (AS) put out the candle and lit another (8) one. Talha and Zubair exchanged a glance of surprise and then one (9) of them said: "O Ali, we have come on some (10) important business. But why did you extinguish the first candle?" Imam (11) Ali (AS) replied: "That was a candle bought of treasury funds. (12) As long as I worked for the treasury, I used (13) it. Now you have come for some personal work, so (14) I use the candle bought of my personal fund." Talha and (15) Zubair left him without saying another word.

PROPHET MUHAMMAD - A ROLE MODEL

The behaviour and personality of Prophet Muhammad (Ss) are the (1) best examples to follow in life. A companion of his, (2) who spent full ten years with him, has said: "Throughout (3) my stay with him I never heard an indecent word (4) from his lips and never found him rude to anyone. (5) He spoke very politely. He was kind to everyone". Although Muhammad (S) (6) was The Prophet of Allah since his birth and had (7) been appointed by Allah to guide the people, yet he was (8) **not** ashamed of doing his work with his own hands. He (9) **assisted** the members of his family in household work and <u>(10) performed</u> the jobs of other deserving persons with great pleasure. He (11) mended his clothes and shoes. He also took part in <u>(12) the</u> construction of Masjid al-Nabi in Madina along with his (13) companions. His dress was always clean, though simple. He was very (14) mindful of cleanliness. He washed his hands and mouth before (15) and after taking his meals. He was so kind and generous (16) that he never refused a reasonable request of any person. He (17) often distributed edibles among others and went without meals himself. He (18) always helped the needy and the poor and went to the (19) houses of the sick to enquire after their health. As and (20) when he met anyone, especially children, he said "Salamun Alaikum". He always (21) spoke with a smiling face. The Prophet was a model of (22) all the virtues and qualities of a believer described in the (23) Holy Qur'an. None can describe him better than Allah who (24) has said, he possessed the most noble character. The personality of (25) our Prophet is an excellent model to follow.

CLOZE

PRAYER

Allah loves us and has given us blessings. We (1) should be grateful for all His blessings and should thank (2) him. The best way to thank Allah is to pray (salat) to (3) **Him.** Praying to Him is like having a conversation with Him. We (4) **must** pray to Allah five times a day: Once every (5) morning, noon afternoon, evening and night. The time for the morning (6) prayer is from dawn until sunrise. The time for the (7) noon and afternoon prayer is from noon until sunset. The (8) time for the evening and night prayer is from sunset (9) until midnight. Every prayer consists of several parts. Each part is (10) called a Rak'at. The morning prayer consists of two Rak'ats: (11) the noon, afternoon, and night prayers consist of four Rak'ats (12) each, and the evening prayer of three Rak'ats. If our clothes (13) or bodies are not clean before prayer, then we must (14) **clean** them. Before praying we must make Wudhu. Prayer has many (15) benefits. A person who prays is always clean and healthy, (16) like a person who cleans himself five times a day (17) in a stream. A person who prays to Allah five (18) times a day will always think of Allah and remember Him; (19) His actions will be virtuous.

HELP YOURSELF

During the time of Imam Ali (AS) there were some (1) people who never worked and lived a very miserable and (2) unhappy life. One day Imam Ali (AS) asked them: "Where from (3) do you find money to support yourselves and your families?" They (4) replied: "We have no means of livelihood but we depend (5) on Allah." Imam Ali (AS) asked: "How can you live by merely (6) depending on Allah?" They replied, "If we lay hands on (7) some money we spend it, and if we do not (8) get it, we wait for it". This reply surprised Imam Ali (AS) (9) very much. He said to them, "You are gravely mistaken. (10) Faith in Allah and dependence on Him does not mean (11) that one should not work and then hope that Allah (12) will provide him with his living. One who depends on (13) others and is a burden on the society is devoid (14) of the blessings of Allah. On the other hand, faith (15) in Allah means that one should work as hard as (16) he can, and simultaneously hope and pray for Allah's blessings. The (17) Holy Qur'an says: "If you decide to do something, have (18) firm faith in Allah". Allah hates an idle person.

CLOZE

PROPHET YUSUF

Prophet Yusuf from childhood was very smart, handsome, respectful (1) and obedient and his behaviour and personality were much better (2) than all the rest of his brothers. His father Ya'qub loved (3) Yusuf very much and from his smartness and kindness he (4) knew that one-day Yusuf would become a great man. On the (5) other hand, Yusuf's brothers were very jealous of him and (6) treated him very badly. One-day Yusuf's brothers asked their father for (7) **permission** to take Yusuf out to play. When they got to (8) **the** desert they threw Yusuf in a well. They left (9) him there for a nice and merciful person who would (10) **be** coming by looking for water to find him and (11) **take** him out. When Yusuf was down in the well he (12) asked God to save him. Yusuf knew that the kind (13) **God** was everywhere and that He knew about everyone's condition. Eventually, (14) a caravan on its way to Egypt stopped by the (15) well and some of its people went to the well (16) to get some water. They tied a pail to a (17) rope and dropped it down the well. Yusuf held on to the rope and (18) pulled himself out. When the people around the well saw him (19) they became very happy to see such a handsome child. (20) **They** took Yusuf with them to Egypt. Yusuf's father became very (21) sad and lonely in his absence. Ya'qub always prayed to God (22) asking Him to protect Joseph wherever he was. One of the <u>(23) important</u> people of Egypt took Yusuf to his own house and asked (24) his wife to take good care of him. Little by little Yusuf (25) grew up. Everyone knew him as a clean, kind, and (26) honest person. Yusuf soon reached a high rank in Egypt and (27) became a very important person. After a short time famine (lack (28) of food) struck Egypt. Before the coming of the famine Yusuf, (29) who was very smart and kind, had ordered his people to (30) store wheat in their storehouses. He did so in order (31) that people would not go hungry when the famine came. People (32) came from both small and large cities. Yusuf gave them (33) wheat. Even Yusuf's brothers came to buy wheat, but they (34) did not recognise Yusuf. They did not know who he (35) was. When they came to Yusuf he ordered that they should be (36) given some wheat and then he gave their money back to (37) them. His brothers became very happy but they still did not (38) know who he was or why he was being so (39) kind to them. When Yusuf's brothers returned the next time to (40) buy more wheat they recognised him. They thought that Yusuf was (41) going to punish them but Yusuf forgave his brothers. Yusuf's brothers (42) were very ashamed and felt sorry for what they had (43) done. Yusuf asked them to return with their parents to (44) **Egypt**. They returned to their own city and gave the good (45) **news** of Yusuf being alive to their father. Afterwards they all came to Yusuf. (46) **He** showed them all much kindness. Yusuf was one of (47) **The** Prophets of God.

CLOZE

FLIES

Harun once told Bahlul that if he would give (1) correct answer to a question, he would gift him with (2) a thousand dinars of gold. Failing to give him answer, (3) **he** would give instructions to shave off his entire beard (4) **and** moustache. Further he would be exposed before the people (5) in the streets and bazaars, mounted on an ass. To (6) this Bahlul said: "I do not need any worldly wealth (7) **or** money from you. But if I reply correctly, then (8) **you** undertake to order the flies not to harass us". Harun (9) after a little thought replied: "That is not possible as (10) the flies around are not under my control". To this Bahlul (11) retorted: "What could be expected from a person who has (12) **no** control over tiny weak creatures like the flies". By this (13) **statement**, Bahlul implied that one, who could not control and (14) rule over flies, how could he be expected to rule (15) over the whole world as claimed. The true and legitimate (16) Caliph and vicegerent of the Prophet could only be the (17) one who had control and rule over all the creatures, (18) like Ali, son of Abu Talib, who had control over the (19) entire creation inclding all the animals. Every small or big thing (20) **should** be under submission to him. As such Bahlul meant (21) that he may not answer a question from Harun on (22) his stipulated conditions. "...surely those whom you call upon besides (23) Allah cannot create a fly, though they should all gather <u>(24) for</u> it, and should the fly snatch away anything from (25) them, they could not take it back from it weak (26) are the invoker and invoked". Anyhow, Harun then asked what that (27) tree was which had twelve branches and every branch had (28) thirty leaves, and every leaf had one side shining while (29) **another** dark. Bahlul replied: "The tree is the year, the twelve (30) branches are the twelve months and thirty shining and dark (31) leaves are the thirty days of the months". Haroon and his (32) courtiers were flabbergasted to hear this logical answer.

DIVINE HELP

"The blessing and kindness of Allah is close to (1) those who do good to others". (Surah al-A'raf, 7:56). Allah is kind to (2) all His creatures and commands human beings to be kind (3) and good. He desires that all of us should treat (4) one another with love and kindness, and render sympathy and (5) help to those who stand in need of them. A person (6) is considered to be good if he: Helps a needy person. Helps (7) a lost person to find his way. Treats an orphan with (8) compassion Removes a stone lying on the road. Helps a blind person (9) to cross a street. Feeds animals and birds and keeps them (10) in comfort. Allah loves those who do good deeds and help (11) others. He gives them a much greater reward, as compared (12) with the assistance rendered by them to others.

PARENTS

"Your Lord has commanded you not to worship anybody (1) but Him, and you must be kind to your parents" (Surah (2) Bani Israel, 17:23). Allah has created us and given us countless gifts (3) so that we may live a happy and peaceful life. (4) It is, therefore, our duty to thank Him and worship (5) Him. In The Holy Qur'an obedience to parents has been mentioned (6) at many places along with obedience to Allah and in (7) some cases it has been mentioned as the first recommendation (8) to the children of Adam. Our parents have done great favours to (9) us. They have borne many hardships to bring us up. It (10) is, therefore, necessary for us to appreciate the good they (11) have done to us. We should obey their lawful orders. (12) We should try, our level best to recompense them for (13) their kindness, so that Almighty Allah may also be pleased (14) with us. Islam has laid great stress on the good treatment (15) of one's parents. Allah is pleased with those who keep their (16) parents happy, and one invites His wrath by annoying them.

GOOD BEHAVIOR

"One group of people should not make fun of (1) another group of people. May be they (the latter) are better (2) than they (the former)". (Surah al-Hujurat, 49:11.) Some people make fun of others, and (3) humiliate them in the eyes of their fellow-beings. People who (4) speak ill of others, are usually those whose education and (5) upbringing have not been up to the mark, and who (6) have not learnt proper social manners. They are not perhaps, (7) aware that all human beings are equal, and no one (8) has the right to humiliate or hurt another. They also (9) forget that it is quite possible, that those whom they (10) ridicule may in fact be better people than themselves, because (11) of their good qualities. It is the duty of every Muslim (12) to respect others. If he observes any defect in the (13) body, dress or house of another, he should not laugh (14) at him or ridicule him.

SPEAKING THE TRUH

"Speak truthfully so that Allah may reform your deeds" (Surah (1) al-Ahzab, 33:70) Truthfulness is one of the most basic things for the (2) establishment of mutual social relations. Islam has, therefore, attached much (3) importance to truthfulness as a moral value and The Holy (4) Qur'an has mentioned it on various occasions. People trust a man (5) who speaks rightly and truthfully. They hold him in esteem (6) and accept every word of his to be correct. On the (7) other hand, if a man tells lies and talks foolishly and (8) extravagantly, he loses credit in the eyes of the people and (9) Almighty Allah is also displeased with him. If we always talk (10) wisely and are truthful, Allah helps us in doing good and (11) useful things, and in leading a prosperous life. We should (12) always remember that truthfulness is the basis of one's dignity and (13) honour.
